Residents have expressed concern about insulating their homes when living in a grade II and Grade II* building and the lack of clear guidance available. A good source of information is Historic England <a href="https://historicengland.org.uk/advice/technical-advice/retrofit-and-energy-efficiency-in-historic-buildings/insulating-walls-in-historic-buildings/I am also looking to arrange a visit from our Heritage Team to give a practical talk and answer any questions you might have in late autumn - dates and venues to be confirmed. Please let me know if you are interested.

We also have our very own insulation team here in Debenham working on producing a general advice pack, along with the ability to use the Thermal Imaging Camera from the **Debenham Green Team** - some of you may have received a recent insulation survey. **Warm Homes Suffolk** is also continuing and for households who's income is £31,000 or less and live in a home with an EPC rating of D or worse and who do not have gas central heating, weather you own the property, rent it or are the landlord help is available.
